Cabot clients work hard and yet do not have access to health insurance.

The Hispanic community is growing faster than any other segment of Kansas City's population. With this growth comes an ever-increasing demand for high-quality, affordable, and bilingual (Spanish and English) health care services.

Cabot Westside Health Center works to fulfill this need by providing quality, culturally sensitive, primary health and dental care, and education services to thousands of patients on the Westside, and people from across the Greater Kansas City area, regardless of their ability to pay.



A History of Serving Kansas City's Westside

Cabot's tradition of caring for those in need began more than a century ago. First developed as an 11-bed ward at Saint Luke's Hospital, Cabot evolved into a free summer camp for underprivileged and at-risk infants. Over time, Cabot's services evolved to meet the health care needs of the Westside, an area traditionally home to immigrants of German, Irish, Italian, and Jewish heritage. Today, Cabot's patient base is predominantly Hispanic.

Past to Present

- 1906** Originally known as Saint Luke's Hospital Club, Cabot was founded by 11 women to care for sick children.
- 1981** Sliding fee scale was initiated. Became Medicaid certified.
- 1999** Formally affiliated with Saint Luke's Health System.
- 2000** New pediatric clinic opened.
- 2004** Moved to 2121 Summit.
- 2006** Celebrating 100 years.
- 2008** Serving more than 7,400 patients.

Kansas City's Hispanic Community

Hispanics comprise 5.2 percent of Kansas City's population, numbering more than 113,000 and growing.

Historically, many Hispanics are reluctant to seek medical care because of language and cultural barriers. They will go to Cabot because of its reputation for quality medical and dental care. Nearly 90 percent of Cabot patients speak Spanish, all of Cabot's staff with patient contact is bilingual.
