Requirements

- 18 years of age or older
- High school diploma or equivalent
- Submission of a completed application packet
- Proof of U.S. citizenship
- Submission of immunization record
- Written references from 2 non-family sources
- Ability to attend classes for 5 weeks, 8 hours/day
