COURSE DESCRIPTION AND OBJECTIVES

This four-day program, consisting of didactic lecture and case studies, will be presented in a manner that emphasizes prevention, quality and cost.

Upon completion of this course, the participant should be able to:

1. Identify the rationale and evidence of agents which are approved for the treatment of AD.
2. Discuss current diagnostic and treatment guidelines for asthma.
3. Identify common problems in the management of depression.
4. Discuss the appropriate age to discontinue preventive health interventions.
5. Recognize the clinical presentation of generalized anxiety disorder and panic disorder.
6. Identify the commonly used complementary therapies in primary care.
7. Identify the role of hormone replacement therapy in the management of certain menopausal symptoms.
8. Recognize the indications for surgical intervention for obesity.
9. Recognize the pharmacologic principles in the alteration of normal menstrual timing.
10. Recognize some unusual causes of pulmonary disease.
11. Appreciate the possible causes of depression in the post-partum patient.
12. Recognize that ejection fraction alone does not always explain heart failure and that other echo parameters have prognostic value.
13. Identify the rationale for different treatment strategies in managing patients with atrial fibrillation.
14. Discuss the data on both primary and secondary prevention in the management of coronary artery disease and heart failure.
