COURSE DESCRIPTION AND OBJECTIVES

This four-day program, consisting of didactic lecture and case studies using an interactive computer response system, will be presented in a manner that emphasizes prevention, quality and cost.

Upon completion of this course, the participant should be able to:

1. Utilize preventive cardiology strategies.
2. Recognize the association between celiac disease/gluten sensitivity and irritable bowel syndrome.
3. Discuss the pharmacology of nicotine addiction and be familiar with avenues for tobacco cessation.
4. Relate several areas of public ethical concern relative to physician:industry relationships in private practice, medical education and biomedical research, as well as identify potential remedies to restore trust.
5. Identify common skin conditions.
6. Evaluate nodules discovered in the pituitary, thyroid and adrenal glands using laboratory testing and imaging procedures.
7. Associate skin disorders to underlying diseases.
8. Recognize the role of vitamin D in the prevention and treatment of osteoporosis and be familiar with new potential therapies.
9. Describe the differences in the clinical presentations and treatment of ulcerative colitis and Crohn's Disease.
10. Discuss the conflicting data regarding the screening of patients with dyspepsia for Barrett's esophagus.
11. List immunization requirements for overseas travel and be more aware of resources available to receive medical care in foreign countries.
12. Recognize the importance of offering colon cancer screening to primary care patients and the current and future methods available for screening.
13. Identify EMR capabilities that might apply to individual practice situations.
14. Differentiate between common dermatological diseases.
15. Identify effective methods of preventing Diabetes Mellitus in high risk individuals.
16. Recognize common atrial arrhythmias and more confidently distinguish ventricular tachycardia from SVT with aberrancy.
17. Identify the limitations of accuracy of exercise ECG testing and SPECT imaging, of how to use Positron Emission Tomography myocardial perfusion imaging, and, a better understanding of the role of coronary CT Angiography.

COURSE DESCRIPTION AND OBJECTIVES

This pediatric symposium will address common pediatric problems and is designed for family physicians and pediatricians.

Upon completion of this course participants should be able to:

1. Identify the appropriate times to use antiviral medication.
2. Recognize the similarities and differences of live and inactivated influenza vaccination.
3. Discuss new treatment regimens for invasive MRSA infections.
4. Discuss new treatment regimens for skin and soft tissue infections.
5. Manage hypertension in children and adults.
6. Identify common causes of hematuria and proteinuria in children.
7. Identify and apply evidenced based therapies for the treatment of enuresis.
8. Recognize associated symptoms of abdominal pain that suggest the need for further evaluation.
9. Recognize common presentations of uncommon pediatric illnesses.
10. Identify common injuries visually.
11. Discuss the differential diagnosis of the red eye.
12. Diagnose and treat common linear skin lesions of childhood.
13. Discuss the differential diagnosis of hair loss in children.
14. Manage patients with common emergent dermatologic disorders.
